Child safety

Body Safety Education aims to empower children with 5 essential rules to protect them from harm and abuse. Developed by educator, Jayneen Sanders, this program equips educators and parents with resources to teach children about body safety without discussing sex or sexual abuse. It teaches kids: Your body is yours; nobody should touch your private areas. If someone touches you inappropriately, tell a trusted adult and keep telling until believed. Learn to differentiate between safe and unsafe touch. Understand the concepts of respect and consent. Know what to do if feeling worried or unsafe. There are videos available on YouTube with teaching body safety to children

Around the rooms

F/1 - Mrs. Chadwick

This week, our class has been reading Dr. Seuss and building rhyming hats using all of our new sounds. We have also ventured outside with our rhyming words to make hop-scotch paths. Grade 1's have began building their writing stamina through "rocket writing". In Maths, we have been practicing building bundles of 10 to organise larger numbers. During Religion lessons, we have explored Holy Week and built the Easter story in the sandpit with Lego men.

Year 2 - Mrs. Craig

This week, the Year 2 class have been busy burning some serious brain energy. From cross country training around the oval, place value problems with 3-4 digit numbers to writing about farm animals ... we have done it all. We have also been scrubbing up on our knowledge of Australian Geography and we think we have finally retained the state and territory names along with their capital cities.

Year 3/4 - Ms. Watt

This week, the Year 3/4s have been exploring the faces of Caritas Australia's Project Compassion and researching the three countries that Ronita, Leaia and Memory come from: The Philippines, Samoa and Malawi. As a class, we have discovered delicious new foods, aweinspiring places and have even begun learning Filipino (formally Tagalog; the national language of the Philippines). All of this is leading to a fantastic celebration of diversity next week!

Year 5/6 - Ms. Simpson

In English, we have been studying the book 'I am David' and this week will reveal the exciting ending! We have had many thought provoking conversations raised by the book as we have joined 12 year old David in his escape from a concentration camp towards....hope. In Maths, students are beginning to investigate data and graphs and a form of information. Students have done very well in their Place Value studies leading up to this week. In geography, we have been creating our own version of The Amazing Race involving visits to 6 different countries around the world, along with 'Challenges' and 'Road Blocks'. Now, if we could get enough funding to actually do the challenges....! In Religion, we have been learning about the work Caritas Australia does to improve conditions for communities. We have spent time focussing on Hope and the difference having Hope can make in one's life, quite a difficult concept but one which we have been able to discover in our novel study for support as well.

Recently I have completed some professional development in using sentence builders to support teachers and students when learning another language. Included in this newsletter is a brief summary of the units each class is currently learning in Indonesian and the sentence builders we are using to support our learning.

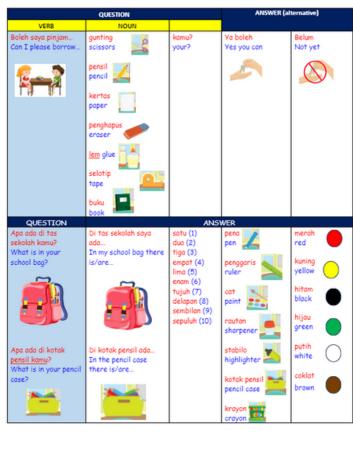

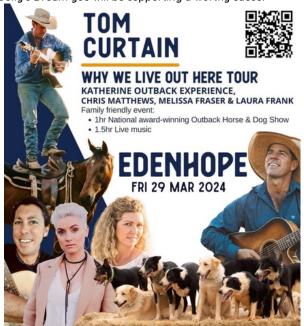
